Formation of the University Council

On 31 July 2021, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President, Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, issued new Decree No. (31) of 2021 on the formation of the University Council of The British University in Dubai.

According to the Decree the <u>University Council</u> remains under the Chancellorship of His Highness Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al Maktoum while the Vice Chancellor acts as the head of the University. Other members of the Board include His Excellency Mirza Al Sayegh, His Excellency Ahmad Al Muhairbi, Sheikha Hind Al Mualla, and a representative from Dubai Holding, the British Business Group in Dubai and Northern Emirates, Emirates NBD, Rolls-Royce International, the British Council, and Atkins, a member of SNC-Lavalin Group. The University Council will serve for three years starting from the effective date of this Decree.

New engineering lab



The Engineering Lab is equipped with state-of-the-art equipment including high quality measuring, testing and manufacturing equipment such as Lathe and Milling Machines, 3D Printers, Hardness testing equipment, thin cylinders, tensile and compression testing devices.

The lab also has high tech equipment for electrical and electronic technology, such as DC and AC motor kits, FPGA development boards and complete test benches with hundreds of components to give students hands-on knowledge of various electrical and electronics concepts.

The lab provides students with a diverse range of practical skills in Electrical, Mechanical and Electronic sub-domains of the Engineering programme, enabling them to specialise in avionics, manufacturing and process engineering to satisfy the emerging trends and growing engineering demands in the UAE and beyond.

Collaboration with Lancaster University

BUiD's Centre for Research in Digital Education collaborated with Lancaster University's Centre for Technology Enhanced Learning (CTEL) and hosted a webinar on 27 April 2021 titled 'Technology Enhanced Learning in the MENA Region'. BUiD professor wins Dubai Courts competition



Professor Khaled Shaalan, Head of Computer Science programmes, won the third place in the 'Innovate with Human Resources' competition organised by Dubai Courts. Professor Shaalan won the award for his proposal of a Legal Document Classification Model which aims to classify legal files automatically using artificial intelligence.

The main objective of the project is to reduce manual work which will result in reducing costs and errors and making file sorting, saving and referral to cases with similar rulings easier.

Research news

The Fifth International Conference on Al Computational Linguistics (ACLing 2021)

BUiD organised ACLing 2021 in collaboration with Newgiza University in Egypt. The 2-day conference was held virtually on 4-5 June 2021. Professor Mona Diab, Professor of Computer Science at George Washington University, gave the keynote speech titled 'Faithfulness in natural language generation in an era of heightened ethical AI awareness: opportunities for MT'. The conference was co-chaired by Professor Shaalan and Professor Samhaa El-Beltagy, the Dean of the School of Information Technology at Newgiza University.

ACLing

The scope of the conference encompasses the theory and practice of all aspects of Al in Computational Linguistics with regard to text, audio, image, and video. All accepted papers in ACLing 2021 will be published in Procedia Computer Science by ELSEVIER.

Leading Education in Times of Crisis and Beyond

The Faculty of Education organised a conference under the theme 'Leading Education in Times of Crisis and Beyond' on 29 May 2021. The keynote was delivered by Professor Stephen McKinney from the University of Glasgow.

There were 20 international presenters from Australia, Bangladesh, India, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, UAE, UK, Ukraine, and USA. Nearly 20 of BUiD's students also participated in the conference.

The conference aimed to explore opportunities and challenges of leading education in the pandemic and post-pandemic world and to create a platform to share innovative perspectives and approaches to leading in times of crisis and beyond.



Professional Development & Examinations Centre (PDEC)


<u>PDEC</u> expanded its training portfolio to include cyber security training and certification.


PDEC also delivered exams for the Community Development Authority (CDA), NEBOSH exams and IELTS in partnership with the British Council.

BUiD Achievement & Career Excellence (B.ACE)


